- ▶ renew the approvals upon expiry and seek input from the GSC and the proponent to ensure deficiencies are corrected;
- ▶ advise the GSC.

The Government Service Centre will:

- refer requests for such approvals to the DOE;
- provide advice to the DOE during the approval process;
- inspect and approve of proposed sites;
- conduct inspections on a regular basis to assess compliance with approvals and with all applicable provincial environmental regulations. Inspections may be required during the approval process, during construction, during start-up operations, and during normal operations;
- ensure all requirements outlined in the approval are met including delivery of monitoring, sampling, and reporting data and maintain databases of same;
- take steps that are necessary, including enforcement, to bring the operation into compliance where violations of the approval or legislation are identified;
- advise the Department of Environment of any noted deficiencies in the approvals and/or the approval process.

4.2 Collection

4.2.1 *With respect to liquid waste water collection approvals;*

The Department of Environment will:

- ▶ prepare approvals for liquid waste collectors that operate or plan to operate on a province-wide basis. These will generally include the larger operations with greater than two vacuum trucks in operation;
- ▶ advise the proponent of the role and responsibility of the two departments;
- ▶ develop policies and guidelines for collection and disposal of liquid wastes;
- ▶ renew the approvals upon expiry and seek input from the GSC and the proponent to ensure deficiencies are corrected.

The Government Service Centre will:

- conduct inspections on a regular basis to assess compliance with approvals issued by DOE and with all applicable provincial environmental regulations. Inspections may be required during the approval process, during construction/set-up, during start-up operations, and during normal operations;
- ensure all necessary documentation required in the approvals is submitted;
- using the province wide DOE approvals as a template, issue approvals for liquid waste collectors that predominantly operate on a regional basis.
